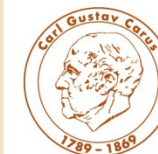

### Dear Colleagues,

Virginia Apgar’s complain concerning the poor quality of studies on delivery room management was published more than half a century ago. Since that time, delivery room management plays an important role for the quality of survival of newborns. However, scientific interest has been limited.

To give researchers and clinicians with a special interest in DR-management a **platform for scientific exchange**, the first “European Symposium on Delivery Room Management” was organised in Dresden in 2009. The tradition continues for the fourth time, due to the great success of the first three meetings. The meeting is also a platform of scientific exchange for the European Scientific Collaboration of Neonatal Resuscitation Research (ESCNR), which is an active collaboration of clinical researchers of DR management.

During the symposium there are many opportunities for **detailed discussions** on practical aspects and theoretical background of DR-management. Distinguished speakers are invited to share their experiences and discuss various aspects on neonatal resuscitation.


For the second time, a “**Video-Session**” gives the opportunity to present videos of DR-management and share the practical experience with participants.
