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### 3. SCIN-Newsletter (June 2022)

Dear colleagues,

With this 3rd issue of our monthly newsletter we would like to inform you again about the current status of our joint project "SCIN - Survey on Currently applied Interventions in Neonatal resuscitation" and pass on important information to you.

#### **Recruitment**

Last month, 2 more clinics in Austria were included. **This brings the total number of clinics participating in the survey to 44.**

#### **Survey**

By now, almost all clinics have submitted at least one month's data. So far, **1805 newborns with interventions have been recorded** in our database - an increase of almost 1000 newborns since the last newsletter! We thank you for your commitment and look forward to the feedback still outstanding for June!

#### **Important updates**

30-minute limit vs. end of primary care - As we have received individual queries about the last clarification of the 30-minute limit, we would like to point out again that this is only an inclusion criterion for newborns. In principle, however, all interventions up to the end of primary care should be recorded, even if they take place after 30 minutes have elapsed. We cannot provide a fixed definition for the "end of primary care", as the work processes differ considerably from hospital to hospital, both within Germany and especially internationally. We therefore leave it up to you to determine for your location when primary care is considered to have ended, but we recommend that the limit is the removal of the child from the primary care unit.

Application for DRKS registration - The registration of the survey in the German Clinical Trials Registry (Deutsches Register Klinische Studien, DRKS) as an official WHO trial registry has been applied for under the registration number DRKS00029736. Confirmation was still pending at the time of newsletter dispatch.
