Professorship (W2) for Pancreatic and Transplantation Surgery

The Professorship is assigned to the Department of Visceral, Thoracic and Vascular Surgery and will lead the respective clinical section as an attending.

As holder of the Professorship we expect you to represent and advance pancreatic and transplant surgery in research, teaching and clinical care. You have a broad and long-standing expertise in open, minimally invasive and especially robotic pancreatic surgery and a broad surgical experience in the whole field of visceral transplant surgery. As a successful candidate you need to have a research focus in pancreatic and/or transplant surgery including robotic surgery, along with the development and conduction of clinical and translational research. You should also be recognized nationally and internationally, documented through participation in national and international research cooperations and should have a record in third-party fund raising.

According to the interdisciplinary character of modern surgery, we anticipate your close cooperation with the National Center for Tumor Diseases/UCC and to other departments and institutes of the University Hospital and the planned transplant center.

We expect you to actively participate in the preexisting infrastructures and research topics of the Faculty of Medicine. We also anticipate your dedication to the Dresdner model of problem-oriented teaching in German and in English language, as well as your commitment in academic self-governance.

The employment of professors with medical tasks is carried out at the University Hospital Dresden in the scope of non-pay-scale employment contracts with a basic remuneration and a performance- and success-related compensation.

Prerequisites according to § 58 SächsHSFG include a university degree in medicine, a doctoral degree and a post-doctoral degree/habilitation or an equivalent qualification record. Board certification for visceral surgery and the permission to work clinically in Germany is mandatory.

The Faculty of Medicine aspires to increase the number of women in research and teaching, and strongly encourages women to apply for this position. We also welcome applications from scientists with disabilities.
