The chair is assigned to the University Center for Orthopaedic, Trauma and Plastic Surgery (OUPC). UOPC is one of leading centers for musculoskeletal surgery and has a tremendous reputation particularly for the surgical treatment of spinal disorders due to degeneration, trauma and tumor. It was responsible and had a leading role in the establishment of the University Comprehensive Spine Center (UCSC) as a certified Level-1 Spine Center according to the criteria of the German Spine Society (DWG). In particular for the surgical treatment of primary and secondary spine tumors an extensive national and international expertise was developed.

We expect you to head the respective clinical section of spine surgery at the University Center for Orthopaedic, Trauma and Plastic Surgery (OUPC) and provide interdisciplinary leadership at the University Comprehensive Spine Center (UCSC). For this, a close clinical and personal interaction with all involved disciplines and a multidisciplinary collaboration of the relative diagnostic and therapeutic members of the University Comprehensive Spine Center (UCSC) is required. We expect you to contribute your experience in spine surgery to both student teaching at OUPC and translational research. We explicitly support your cooperation with the National Tumor Center Dresden (NCT/UCC), the Center for Translational Bone, Joint and Soft Tissue Research (TFO) as well as other institutions of TU Dresden and non-university research facilities.

For further strengthening the spine surgery segment, we are looking for a candidate with outstanding clinical and scientific qualification. The successful candidate is expected to be qualified with a broad and long-standing expertise in the management of spinal trauma, degenerative spine disease and most of all clear focus in treatment of primary and secondary spine tumors (vertebral sarcoma, spinal metastasis). We expect you to have an extensive national and international network in relevant professional academies and associations for spine surgery, experience in participating in or leading a spine center and evidence of a personal DWG certificate at the highest level (master / excellence) or equivalent qualification.

Prerequisites according to § 58 SächsHSFG include a university degree in medicine, a doctoral degree and a post-doctoral degree/habilitation or an equivalent qualification record. Board certification for orthopaedic and trauma surgery, additional qualification for special trauma surgery or / and Special Orthopedic surgery and the permission to work clinically in Germany are mandatory. Ideally, you are already a well-known international clinical researcher and have extensive experience in obtaining external funding and relevant and extensive management and leadership experience.

The employment of professors with medical tasks is carried out according to non-pay scale employment contracts with a basic remuneration and performance- and success-related remuneration components. The Faculty of Medicine seeks to employ more women in leadership positions and strongly encourages qualified women to apply. We also welcome applications from qualified candidates with disabilities or those with additional support needs.
