Full Professorship for Translational Medical Oncology (W3)

The NCT with its partner sites in Heidelberg and Dresden is a strategic alliance of the DKFZ, the Helmholtz Center Dresden-Rossendorf (HZDR) and university partners in Heidelberg and Dresden that aims to establish an international center of excellence of patient-oriented translational cancer research in Germany. The holder of the professorship for Translational Medical Oncology is expected to develop innovative concepts of systemic anti-cancer therapies with a special focus on solid tumors, and to translate such approaches to early-phase clinical trials. The research portfolio we seek includes identifying resistance factors and developing strategies to counteract them through the use of innovative, molecular-targeted therapeutic agents as well as immunotherapeutic or genetic approaches, each in combination with respective biomarkers for individualized diagnosis and therapy monitoring. The integration of novel approaches in multimodal combination therapy is also of interest.

We are looking for an internationally recognized, outstanding researcher with excellent expertise in the above research field. The successful candidate will contribute significantly to the establishment of the NCT partner site Dresden as well as to the development of structures connecting the partner sites. The professorship will closely cooperate with the newly established Multidisciplinary Systemic Therapy Unit, the Phase I Unit, the Medical Clinic I of the University Hospital Carl Gustav Carus Dresden, all partners cooperating within the NCT, the University Cancer Center Dresden (UCC), the DKFZ and the German Cancer Consortium (DKTK). The professorship is expected to be engaged in the Dresden program of problem-oriented medical teaching, the NCT School of Oncology as well as in the academic self-administration of the university.

The DKFZ, the HZDR and the Medical Faculty as well as the University Hospital Carl Gustav Carus offer an out-standing scientific environment at the NCT partner site Dresden, including a large number of core facilities that can be used by the successful candidate. Moreover, the professorship benefits from close contacts with the NCT site in Heidelberg as well as with DKTK research groups that are working in diverse areas of pre-clinical and clinical cancer research in the fields of biology, physics or medicine.

As a general rule, the successful candidate will be employed by the DKFZ according to the "Jülicher Modell". In the event that the professorship entails significant clinical responsibilities, the University Hospital Carl Gustav Carus Dresden will issue an employment contract.

Clinical trials and the use of clinical facilities will be carried out in consultation with the directors of the involved clinics as well as with the head of the NCT/UCC Multidisciplinary Systemic Therapy Unit and of the NCT/UCC Phase I Unit. Where necessary or upon request, the professor will also be appointed as a section head of the Medical Clinic I.

In accordance with § 58 SächsHSG (Saxon Law on Higher Education), candidates must have completed university studies in medicine, a doctorate and habilitation or equivalent scientific accomplishments and have a proven track record in teaching. The successful candidate must have all necessary qualifications to practice medicine in Germany. Ideally, the successful candidate will be an approved medical specialist in internal medicine, hematology and oncology and have a proven track record of scientific and/or clinical leadership experience as well as the ability to raise third-party funds. We are interested in your main areas of research and look forward to receiving your application.

The Faculty of Medicine and the DKFZ are committed to increasing the percentage of female scientists and encourage female applicants to apply. Among candidates of equal aptitude and qualifications, applicants with disabilities will be given preference.
